


PRELIMINARY STATISTICAL NOTE

POPULATION GROWTH ACROSS NORTHERN AUSTRALIA 2017-18

CAIRNS REGION DOWN MARGINALLY, BUT STILL LEADING THE WAY

Residential population figures released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics for 2017-18 show a decline in growth across Northern Australia with Cairns down marginally but still leading the way. Growth rates are well below long-term averages. (See Chart #1)

The Cairns region and Cairns City continued to lead the way in the North (See Charts #2 & #3) and to further consolidate the regions position as the largest in population in Northern Australia. (See Chart #4).




Chart #2: Population Growth Northern Australia, Major Commercial Regions, 2017-18




Chart #3: Population Growth Northern Australia, Major Cities, 2017-18




Chart #4: Population Northern Australia, Major Commercial Regions, 2017-18

Regional Milestone

The immediate Cairns region (Cairns, Cassowary Coast, Tablelands, Mareeba and Douglas) has now pushed over the 250,000 quarter of a million mark and if the outlying areas of the Cape, Torres and Carpentaria are included, the population that looks to Cairns as its regional capital at 292,000 is now close to 300,000. Population in combined Central and Northern Queensland regions is sitting at 962,000, i.e. just under one million.

Regional Patterns

Cairns LGA continues to hold onto growth at 1.1% but well below the 17-year average since 2001 of 2.2%.

Mackay and Central Queensland regions are showing some signs of revival after going backwards following the end of the mining construction boom but growth is still at low levels.

Townsville regions growth is down to 0.3% and the city 0.6%.

The end of the construction of the Darwin LNG project has seen a collapse of growth of Darwin and the Northern Territory that was negative in 2017/18.

The Kimberley Pilbara region has also seen growth strongly affected by the retreat of the mining boom and remains low.



Patterns within Cairns Region

Within the Cairns Tropical North Queensland region there has been growth across most Local Government Areas (See Table #5) with a notable exception being Douglas Shire. Good growth was recorded in Mareeba, Cook, Weipa and most Aboriginal & Torres Strait Island Communities.




Chart #6: Population Growth Northern Australia, City Hinterland, 2017-18
